## SUMMARY HIGHLIGHTS OF SCHOOL ACHIEVEMENTS

*(A Glossary of terms is attached at the back of this report)*

- Outcomes in English, Maths and Science at end of Key Stage 3/Year 9 continue to rise and are above National Averages and at or above targets agreed with the Educational Achievement Service (EAS) that monitors our progress.
- At the end of Key Stage 3/Year 9, more boys are now achieving Level 6+ in English. This level gives a strong indication that by KS4/Year 11 GCSE grade C or above will be reached.
- When compared to similar schools in Wales, we are above the average for the majority of Key Accountability Indicators at KS3/Year 9.
- All students in Year 11 achieved at least 5 qualifications, with no student finishing the year without a qualification. All students achieved a GCSE qualification in English and Maths this year.
- 22% of students in Year 11 achieved 5 or more GCSEs at the highest A/A\* grades with 26% of all results at this level.
- GCSE outcomes in English and Maths at C level and above have remained broadly steady from 2015.
- 97% of all students in Year 11 achieved at least 5 Level 2 qualifications i.e. at or equivalent to a GCSE C grade. This is an excellent achievement when compared to similar schools.
- The percentage of students in Year 11 achieving the Welsh Baccalaureate Intermediate Diploma is 83%, which is a very good outcome.
- In the Sixth Form, students achieved above prior attainment levels in most curriculum areas continuing our trend of statistically significant added value, especially at A Level.
- Achievement of the highest grades of A/A\* at the Level 3 Threshold has increased significantly to 43%, 20% above the National Average.
- 152 Year 13 students achieved the new graded Advanced Welsh Baccalaureate and 68% of results were A/A\*, which is excellent.
- 115 students successfully secured their place at university, 42 to Russell Group institutions that are recognised as the best institution of their type.
- 6 Students successfully gained places at Oxford or Cambridge Universities.

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- 21st Century Learning – Demolition of many original school buildings is near completion; early in 2017, the steel framework of the new school will appear on the site. All members of the school community and the School Council in particular, will continue to work with the County Council's 21st Century Team to finalise internal plans for the look and feel of our new school. National curriculum and assessment reviews continue to be reflected in the School Development Plan and new school design.
- Our Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) programme, piloted in the Sixth Form has now been extended to Year 11. Our 'Foldr' software allows students to securely access their work and shared learning resources anywhere, anytime, anyplace.

**1.5** Welsh is taught as a second language to all students at KS3 and KS4, apart from those students who joined at KS4 from a school outside Wales. The school has developed a bi-lingualism strategy and an action plan has been produced to support the acquisition of Welsh across the school. The school does not have provision for students to receive their education solely through the medium of Welsh. The Subject Leader for Welsh runs the KS2/KS3 Cluster arrangements to ensure continuity of learning when transferring from Primary to Secondary.

- At 96% English outcomes at level 5+ are 1% above results from last year; this level of attainment is equal to the Fischer Family Trust-D (FFT-D) estimate for this subject and the EAS target. At level 6+ the whole cohort was 6% above last year with boys continuing to narrow the gap with the girls.
- Maths outcomes at level 5+ are 2% higher than last year, with a 4% gender gap, in favour of the boys. This is also at the FFT D estimates for the year group and the EAS target. At level 6+, outcomes have improved by 4% with boys exceeding girls by 3%.

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- Science outcomes at level 5+ have improved by 1% to 97% with only a 2% gap between boys and girls. The overall outcome is at FFT D estimates and 1% below our EAS target. At level 6+, outcomes remained steady.
- The CSI at level 5+ has increased by 1% when compared to last year and is now above FFT D estimates and 1% below the EAS target. The gap between boys and girls has narrowed to 3% at this level. At CSI Level 6+ student outcomes were similar to last year with an 8% gap between boys and girls, up from 5% last year but down from 2014 (22%).
- eFSM students improved their outcomes at KS3 last year for all KS3 measures.

- The performance of students in the L2+ threshold in 2016 improved by 1.5% to 70%, maintaining the uplift seen in 2014. Performance in this measure has been consistent since 2014 and the 'rolling three-year average' is at the highest level for the school at 70% for 2014-16, up from 65% for 2013-15 and 63% for 2012-15.
- Every student in Year 11 achieved at least 5 or more Level 1 qualifications last year.
- 97% of students achieved 5 or more Level 2 qualifications last year placing the school in Quartile 1 and above all estimates and targets.
- The Capped Points Score, a measure that is going to become more important over the next few years, increased by 2 points to 373 points. This reflects the higher level of attainment achieved across the Year group in all subjects. This outcome is above the average for our family and retains its place in Quartile 2.

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- There has been a significant increase in the highest grades at GCSE with A/A\* up from 19% to 26% and A\*/B up by 9% to 50%.
- The Core Subject Indicator (CSI) has increased by 1.5% to 67%.
- English outcomes were 1% up on 2015. Results in GCSE English Language improved to 77% from 69% in 2015.
- For the first time, all students achieved a GCSE in Maths last year; this is above family, local and national averages. 76% achieved at least a grade C, similar to 2015, maintaining the improvement seen over the last 5 years. This is 7% behind the average for our family and places the school in quartile 3 when compared to similar schools. There is a 2.5% gender gap in favour of the girls. This gap is half the average gap within our family which is in favour of the boys.
- At 84%, Level 2 Science outcomes reduced this year by 9% following the highest ever results last year. This reflects the reduced number of students who followed a Level 2 vocational pathway in Science this year. The number of students who achieved at least one GCSE C+ in Science increased to 70% this year.
- The percentage of students achieving the Welsh Baccalaureate Intermediate Diploma is 83%. Outcomes in Essential Skills have improved in all core areas with 99% of students achieving all 4 Level 2 qualifications.
- 82% of Year 11 eFSM students achieved the Level 2 threshold up from 70% in 2014. 35% also achieved the L2+ threshold.

- Achievement at the highest grades, A\*/A has increased considerably (up 16%) and remains significantly above national averages; A level outcomes at these levels (30%) are particularly positive when compared to ALIS estimates.



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- Achievement at A\*-B and A\*-C also remain significantly above national averages; fluctuations from year to year are to be expected as intake cohorts vary.
- This increase in higher grades is reflected in the significant increase of the Average Wider Points Score from 787 to 911; a score which is significantly above Local Authority and Wales averages.
- A level results are significantly above ALIS estimates and place the school in the top 13% of ALIS schools nationally for value added.
- All subjects achieved in line with or above ALIS estimates; History and Maths achieved results significantly above ALIS estimates this summer, while History, Information Technology, Maths and Further Maths, English Literature, Religious Education and Music Technology have all achieved significantly above ALIS estimate trend data over the last three years.
- Only four courses (fifteen last year) had cohorts with average GCSE scores that were significantly lower than ALIS cohorts in those subjects nationally. The more comprehensive dissemination of course requirements introduced last year has impacted positively on this measure and the resultant student outcomes.
- Year 13 students with ALN achieved a 100% pass rate, with 86.2% of grades at A\* to C and 44.8% of grades at A and A\*. All students gained their university place. An excellent outcome.
- Results in the new graded Advanced Baccalaureate were excellent. Year 13 were the first 'whole cohort' to follow this advanced qualification; 90% of the cohort achieved an A\*-C with 68% achieving an A\*/A. These results are significantly higher than national outcomes.
- 115 (75%) of the 154 strong Year 13 cohort made successful Higher Education applications through UCAS (including 4 of 5 eFSM students); 48 successful applications were made to Russell Group universities, including 6 to Oxford and Cambridge.
- AS achievement at A grade continues to be good; outcomes at this level are above national data. Outcomes at A-B and A-C, though higher than 2014 are not as high as 2015 or national outcomes. A-E outcomes continue to be strong.

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- Standards in teaching and learning have risen to 88% of lessons being good or better.
- Most staff are involved in working parties to work on school priorities.
- Work scrutiny, learner voice, lesson observations all show good or better standards of learning and teaching.
- Student independence in learning is resulting in higher levels of progress measured by Key Indicators at KS3, 4, 5.

### **Outcome 9**

The Local Authority, with the school governing body, have made the decision to extend provision at the school to include SNRB programmes. The development of the provision will take place throughout 2016-2017.

In 2016/17, the school will set-up the staffing structure and programmes of study, as well as working across the Cluster of Monmouth Primary Schools and the Local Authority.

### **Specifically for 2016 2017**

- Increase the attendance of learners with ALN to 95.1% (2016 – 91.6%, 2015 – 93%, 2014 – 90%)
- Improved outcomes for learners with ALN to raise Level 5 CSI at Key Stage 3 to 65% (2015-16 – 62%, 2014-15 – 64%, 2013-14 – 33.3%), Level 2 at 100% (2013-14 – 89%, 2014-15 – 93%, 2015-16 – 92%) and increase Level 2+ to 30% (2013-14 – 23%, 2014-15 – 10%, 2015-16 – 11.5%).

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- Reduce the number of behaviour referrals made to the Support Centre for learners with ALN to less than 40% (2013-14 – 47%, 2014-15 – 44%).
- Systems and processes to ensure early identification and intervention consistently across the cluster.
- Staffing structure for SNRB set up for September 2017.
- Agreed vision of an inclusive approach to the SNRB Programmes of Learning.

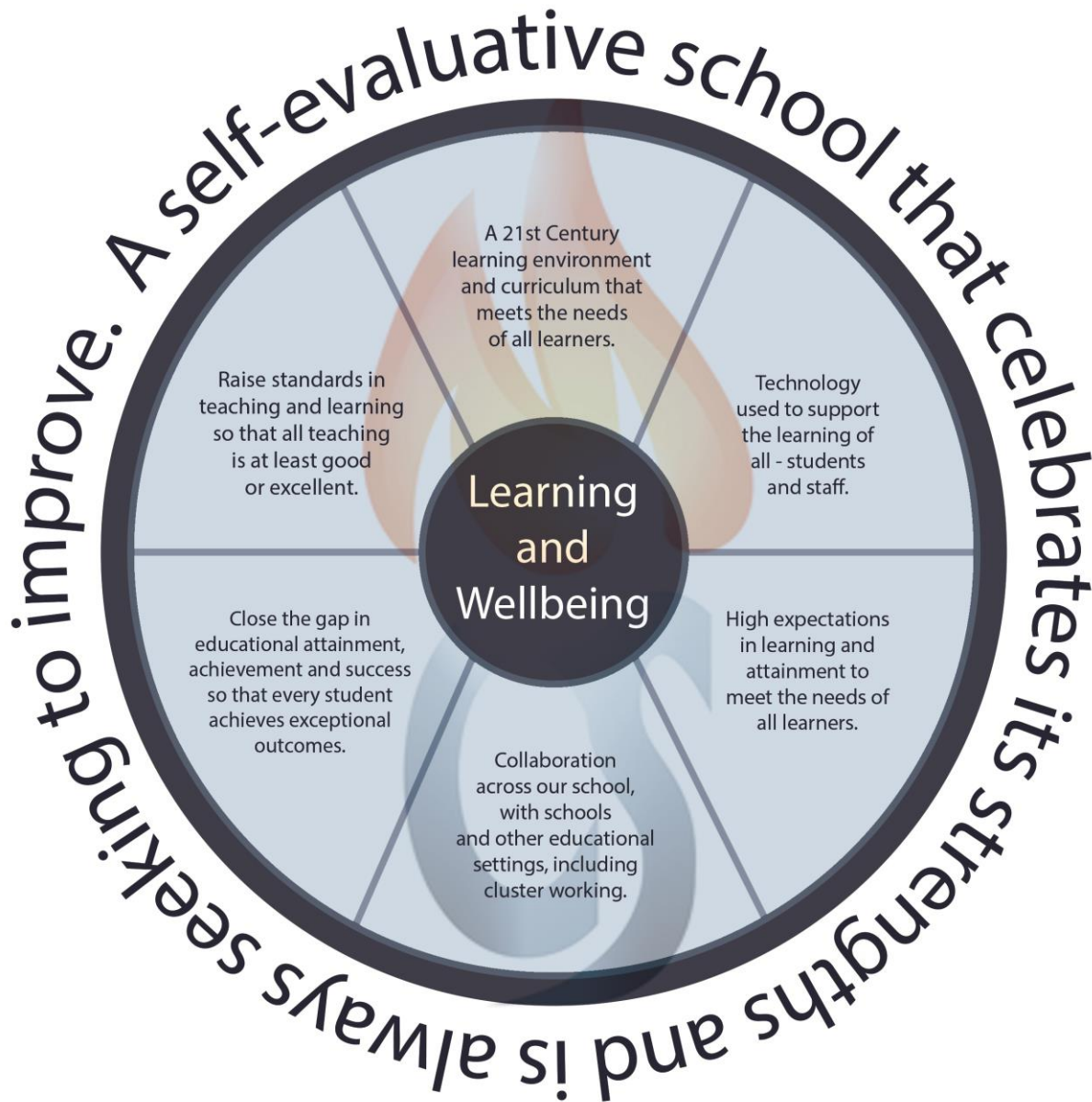

## 5 School Policies

Monmouth Comprehensive School is committed to being inclusive and endeavours to support all learners admitted to the school. Pupils' needs are assessed prior to entry and monitored and reviewed regularly. Appropriate interventions are made to support learning using a variety of strategies to meet individual need. The School's Additional Needs Policy is available on request.

The school accessibility plan recognises the need for access to the physical environment and the curriculum and is reviewed regularly.

The school has adopted/noted the following new LEA policies in the last year:

## 6 Facilities

There are separate lavatory facilities for both male and female students and staff. Disabled Lavatories are available.

During 2016 the following works were carried out across the school site:

- Erection of temporary classrooms, food hall and offices including the new school reception in March; opened in April.
- Following the erection of the new temporary building, demolition of the Gryphon, Sphinx, Unicorn, Dragon buildings, is hoped to be completed in November. Construction of the new school will then begin.
- Classrooms, corridors, Food Hall and stairwells re-painted during the summer.
- White lining of all external steps.
- DDA ramp built to access the AstroTurf, playing fields and leisure centre. This ramp will remain when the new school is built and has been paid for by the 21<sup>st</sup> Century school fund.
- Numerous works for the new school have meant that much of the school's drainage system has been replaced or upgraded.
- Maintenance of the existing school buildings has continued to ensure that areas for teaching and learning are maintained to the highest standards; while mindful in September 2018 we will have a new school.
- PATS testing has been carried out on all items within the school.
- All statutory maintenance has been carried out.
- A new environmental pond has been installed that will be used by the science department, as well as providing a habitat for many of the school's wildlife inhabitants.

<b>BTEC</b>	A Vocational course that can be taken at Foundation, Intermediate and Advanced Level.
<b>CIF</b>	Common Inspection Framework used by the Welsh Inspectorate of Schools, ESTYN.
<b>Cluster</b>	A group of schools that collaborate regularly in working together. This normally refers to the work of Primary and Secondary schools when they come together to develop practice.
<b>Cohort</b>	The year group of students moving through the school.
<b>CSI</b>	Core Subject Indicator (Level 2 – English, Mathematics, Science)
<b>EAS</b>	Education Achievement Service – Consortium of School Support Services.
<b>ELQ</b>	Entry Level Qualification
<b>Estyn</b>	Office of Her Majesty's Inspectorate for Education and Training in Wales. Purpose of Estyn is to inspect quality and standards in education and training in Wales.
<b>KQ1/2/3</b>	Key Quality Indicator used by ESTYN to inspect Schools
<b>Family</b>	All schools in Wales belong to a 'family' of schools, to support development
<b>FFT</b>	Fischer Family Trust. A company that provides data on students' estimated attainment grade.
<b>FFT B</b>	Provides estimates for student progress based on similar schools ('similar' refers to schools with comparable deprivation, FSM and prior attainment)
<b>FFT D</b>	Provides estimates for student progress based on the top 25% achieving schools.
<b>e-FSM / FSM</b>	Free School Meals. Pupils are in receipt of resources from the PDG grant.
<b>GCSE</b>	General Certificate of Secondary Education –A two year course delivered at Key Stage 4.
<b>IT</b>	Information Technology - the use of modern technologies to support learning.
<b>Key Stage 3</b>	National Curriculum in Wales for 11- 13 year olds. Students are working within attainment levels 4-8. Level 5+ refers to students achieving Level 5 and above; Level 6+ refers to students achieving Level 6 and above.
<b>Key Stage 4</b>	National Curriculum in Wales for 14-16 year olds.
<b>Key Stage 5</b>	National Curriculum in Wales for 16-18 Year olds.
<b>LA</b>	Local Authority
<b>Level 1 and 2 Threshold</b>	The National qualification Framework groups different examination outcomes into Levels to assist with understanding how a qualification compares to others nationally.
