Senior Rowing – Rower of the Year**Eleanor Lawrence-Preston**

Eleanor set the club record for girls 2km fitness test with a time of 7:19.1, in the process Eleanor became the youngest member to set a club record at the age of 15. Eleanor finished 2nd at National Indoors at WJ16 and became the first rower to be invited to a GB U16 training camp. She was also part of the first boat to reach an A Final at National Schools Regatta in Sweep. At Wales trials, Eleanor attempted to make both the sweep and sculling teams. She rowed 50km across two days and managed to be recognised as a genuine candidate for both squads. Eleanor will represent Wales this summer with her pairs partner, Seren, in Scotland, all before she turns 16.

Senior Rowing – Improvement**Sandy Kohler-Hoon**

Sandy improved his 2km time by nearly a minute and was the first student in his squad to go sub 7mins on his 2km fitness test. Sandy has also become a model member of our club, showing great dedication to not only being the best but also supporting younger members.

Team of the Year**Eleanor Lawrence-Preston and Seren Van Der Horst**

Eleanor and Seren set a new standard not for just women's rowing at MCS but for everyone at MCS. Inside 60 days they had changed rowing disciplines from sculling to sweep which they had never rowed together and something which Eleanor had never done. In sweep rowing, and in particular in a pair, you need total reliance on, and support of, the other crew member as you work in together with one blade each to go as straight and fast as possible. It is the hardest crew boat to row in let alone race in. Within 60 days of their first pairing, Seren and Eleanor achieved the following: they became the first sweep boat to reach an A Final at National Schools Regatta (the biggest national school event in the country) and came 6th and were the fastest women's pair at Wales Trials and will represent Wales at the Home International Regatta this summer in Scotland. They are the fastest ever women's sweep crew the school has ever produced and this was all achieved in 60 days of their first outing together.

KS3 Athletics – Athlete of the Year**Macs Perrou**

Macs has excelled in the Javelin this academic year. Firstly, Macs represented Monmouth Comprehensive School at the Newport West District Championships and won the Junior Boys competition throwing 28.15m, beating 2nd place by nearly 12m. Macs was then selected to represent Newport West at the South East Wales Championships where he won the Junior Boys Javelin with a distance of 28.89m. Macs is now representing South East Wales at the Welsh Championships in Cardiff.

KS3 Athletics - Dedication**Dottie Williams**

Dottie has been a committed member of the Junior Girls Athletics squad representing Monmouth Comprehensive School in the 800m. Dottie has worked really hard over the last few years to really push herself in this event. The highlight was Dottie coming 1st in the Junior Girls Cup competition, winning by five seconds over the second placed athlete. Well done Dottie!
